Dear All SPO's 35 States (as per list)

This is in continuation to my DO letter of even number dated 28.1.2014 regarding prevention and control of vector borne diseases. Please find enclosed herewith the statement of Grant-in-Aid (GIA) released from NVBDCP to States/UTs during F.Y. 2013-14 (Annex -I). As per the latest SOEs available with this Directorate, the information relating to expenditure reported by States/UTs and the available unspent balance is indicated against the respective State/UT. As per guidelines, the SOEs for the last quarter upto 31.03.2014 was to be submitted by 10th April, 2014 to NVBDCP and concerned officials may be instructed to strictly follow the guidelines and submit at the earliest for updating the information. The budgetary requirement for the financial year 2014-15 may be submitted to this Directorate considering the balance amount carried over from the last financial year.

In addition to above, you are also requested to ensure the following:

- Implementation of activities as per the Strategic Action Plan (SAP) 2012-2017 already circulated to all states, for achieving pre-elimination status of Malaria i.e. <1 API.
- IRS schedule along-with supervision plan may be forwarded to this Directorate, so that the Nodal Officers and Officers from ROH&FW can be deputed for supervision.
- Please observe World Malaria Day (WMD) on 25th April, 2014. The theme of WMD is "Invest in the future. Defeat Malaria".
- Ensure quality assurance of Malaria Microscopy for diagnosis with emphasis on cross checking, timely feedback and corrective action under intimation to this Directorate
- The involvement of VHSCs under NHM for vector control especially through environmental management and biological control.
- Environmental management activities for eliminating breeding places e.g. minor repairs, cleaning of drains and de-weeding for ensuring flow of water, etc. and other activities for VBD control requiring manpower on a seasonal basis especially Dengue & Chikungunya, may also be explored by advocacy through Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs).



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- For effective prevention of Dengue/Chikungunya the source reduction activities should be initiated before monsoon. The key containers which contribute maximum breeding of Aedes vector should be identified with the help of Entomological teams and needs to be enumerated and targeted for source reduction on priority before ensuing transmission period.
- Due to complex disease epidemiology of Dengue, multi-pronged strategies by involving other Ministries/Departments are crucial for prevention of mosquito-genic conditions. As mentioned in the Mid Term Plan Octalogues, sensitization of intersectoral partners should be carried out before the onset of transmission followed by periodic reviews to take stock of the activities and impact.
- I also request you to kindly review the stock of diagnostics and drugs and ensure the availability of stock at all health facilities upto the periphery. The list of decentralized items is enclosed for your ready reference. **(Annex- II)**
